Rules & Information

18 Hole Individual Flag Tournament

Players who complete 18 holes in fewer strokes than par plus their handicap (quota of strokes) will proceed to Hole #1 and continue playing until they have exhausted their quota of strokes. Once the player has exhausted their quota of strokes, they will plant their flag where their ball lies after hitting their final stroke. The player whose flag is furthest from Hole #1 tee when their strokes are exhausted will be declared the winner.

Example of Quota of Strokes:

Player A's handicap is 15. Quota of Strokes is 87. $\text{Par (72) + 15 = 87}$

Player A shoots 87. Player A has used up their quota of strokes.

Player B's handicap is 20. Quota of Strokes is 92. $\text{Par (72) + 20 = 92}$

Player B shoots 89 and has 3 strokes remaining. Player B proceeds to Hole #1 to tee off and "plants" their flag where the ball lies after the 3rd shot.

18-Hole 2 Person Low Gross and Low Net

Two person teams will record the best low gross score of the two on one line and the best low net score of the two on a second line. Each line will be totaled to determine the teams total gross and net score.

Need a minimum of three Ladies Twosomes to have a standalone Ladies Flight.

Rules

The Rules of Play applicable to all GACC-sponsored events will be in effect. These will include the "Local Rules" at Cedar Creek Golf Club, a copy of which can be found on the GACC website (gaccgolf.org) and the Pro Shop.

In this event, **the ball will be played "down in all cases" except where our local rules say otherwise.** Players CANNOT ground their club while playing shots from bunkers; however, grounding your club in waste areas is permissible. Bunkers are distinguished from waste areas by the presence of rakes.

All putts must be holed out, no gimmies.

Any questionable lies encountered during play that are not covered herein should be resolved between the competitors.
